For the Annual Meeting for Worship with Attention to Youth on May 22nd, the weather was beautiful and the parking lot was full. All but a few seats in the meeting room were occupied.

After a period of silence Jennifer Dickie opened the programmed portion of Meeting. Children and teachers of each level of First Day School were invited into the center of the room one class at a time. They introduced themselves or, in the case of the nursery, were introduced. Some teachers shared their joy of being able to interact with these remarkable young people over the past year. Books were presented to students moving up a class and to those graduating some received Bibles.

There were thirteen students graduating from the High School class. Those present received books specially chosen for them by Jonah, their teacher for the past four years.

The Meeting was asked to hold the children and young people in the Light. Also, to hold in the Light those couples who were considering marriage and those who were already married. How does our Meeting help to create and maintain a society whose institutions recognize and do away with the inequities rooted in patterns of prejudice and economic convenience? What steps are we taking to assure that our Meeting reflects our respect for all and are free from practices rooted in prejudice?

But that was a year ago—It seems short to those of us with many years under our belt, but for those of you who have just waded through a half or quarter of your lifetime, this is a very long time. So long that the last time we were here probably isn't even a memory! For others of you

this past year represents a 6<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> or 18<sup>th</sup> of your life.
