# GENEROSITY OF SPIRIT AT ARTISTS' GATHERING: ZAN LOMBARDO AND HER MAGICAL CIRCLE

"Where are our thoughts before we have them?" It was Zan Lombardo talking, standing tall above a three foot high paper circle...well, not just any old paper. It is watercolor paper, 30 feet long and covered with Zan's drawings and, in some sections, her paintings. "Where do our thoughts come from?" Zan asked. "What in the external world inspires our thoughts?"

It was May 13, 2009. There were about 30 Quaker artists seated around the paper circle in an upstairs room at the Arch Street Meetinghouse. We had just enjoyed dinner together, and now we were gathered around Zan and her watercolor circle. Zan's head and upper body were visible but what is she standing on? I kept thinking. It's magical...will she fall? Is she walking on water?

Zan told us the story of her paper circle, moving about within it as she spoke. The idea arose from seeing a long scroll painting in a *National Geographic*, but the project was a long time birthing. Zan spent about two years drawing the sketches before she began painting. She had been painting for the past six months and clearly had a long way to go.

The subject of this work (can we call it monumental?) is unconditional love and interconnectedness. And where do Zan's thoughts for working that out come from? From various sources, Zan told us. "I sit with it. I play with it. I dream of it. And I do a lot of staring at it." For example, thinking about a kiss as energy, Zan came up with chaos, oaks and acorns, smells, and shells and things. And here they are, she said, moving to one section and leaning over the top of the circle to point out details. (What is she walking on? How can she be so surefooted up there? Is she a mountain goat?)

## Maria Cattell, Clerk Fellowship of Quakers in the Arts




