## FLOOD RELIEF IN BOULDER COUNTY


... for those who might not receive help from some usual sources of disaster assistance

As I thought about the floods in the area where I grew up, I realized that there were probably many impacted by the floods whose circumstances are similar to some of the workers on farms in our community. Therefore I wrote to an organization that helps non-English speakers in Boulder County learn English asking what resources are available that reach across language and documentation barriers following the recent floods. As a Red Cross volunteer I had noticed that resources are not always equally accessible to those who do not speak the dominant language.

The reply I received that another organization (www.ourcenter.org) is providing direct relief to Spanish speaking families. I encourage Poplar Ridge Friends who wish to help people impacted by the Boulder Flood to donate to this organization. I did this on line through their website. Red Cross also crosses language barriers to offer assistance and does not require documentation. However, by the stage that has now been reached in the Boulder County flood disaster, Red Cross might typically be beginning to pull back from offering direct assistance to families.
