POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS MINUTES FOR JUNE 19TH, 2016

The Monthly Meeting opened with a period of worship about 11 a.m.; the minutes from the May 22, 2016 meeting were read.

Attending were Joanne Brum, David Connelly, Anne Dalton, Barry Kahn, Suzanne O'Hara, Dill Otis, Sally Otis, Hannah Richter, Joanne Rogers, Andrew Simkin, Jane Simkin, and Paul Simkin.

Dill Otis reported for Ministry and Council that the schedule for July begins with Rebecca Schillenback leading worship on July 3. The second Sunday, July 10, will be the month's unprogrammed meeting; Christina Keefe-Perry speaks on the third Sunday, July 17; A.T. Miller leads on the fourth, July 24; and our last worship we are calling Reading, Song and Silence: Jack Charles, Ann Burch and Howard Nelson will each present a reading, and they will choose a hymn. Anita Paul, a New York Yearly Meeting Friend, is speaking August 24.

For the Outreach Committee, Anne Dalton read a proposed revision of our PRISM, Facebook and email communication policy. The revised policy has minor changes and was approved. The policy is below.

Andy Simkin reporting for the Peace and Social Action Committee said that food for the Friends Historical Association luncheon after a recent worship came partly from leftovers from the Anne Frank Event at the High School the previous Friday. Monthly Meeting approved donating to the Anne Frank event half of whatever the Historical Association donates to us.

The clerk Andrew Simkin reported that Suzanne O'Hara has applied for membership to Monthly Meeting. The application was referred to the Ministry and Council Committee.

Andy brought up the request from David Connelly as the meeting's representative to Poplar Ridge Monthly Meeting that the Monthly Meeting cover his expenses to attend Summer Sessions at Silver Bay. The meeting approved this request up to \$600.

Sally Otis reported that the Union Springs Historical Society has contacted her telling her that it plans a ceremony unveiling a new historical marker at the site of the former the Oakwood Friends Seminary. The society asks for representative from our Meeting to offer a few words at the ceremony, which is at 4 p.m. Thursday June 30. Monthly Meeting agreed that Sally should do it.

In the basement of the Springport Free Library are two benches that were once part of the Union Springs Monthly Meeting. The Library is offering us the benches; we recommend the benches be offered to the Frontenac Historical Society.

We discussed the New York Yearly Meeting's Nurture Committee request that we respond to the Brooklyn Monthly Meeting's minute about FUM's personnel policy. We decided that our Nov. 11, 2014 letter to FUM and our minute from Sept. 11, 2005 are sufficient to forward to the Nurture Committee.

The Meeting closed with a period of silence at about 1:15 p.m.

The Poplar Ridge Monthly Meeting is considering the roles of PRISM, Facebook and the email announcements list in our community. We are receiving more requests to distribute announcements and information and feel that we need to define how these various forms of communication to the community should best be used.

The purpose of our PRISM Newsletter is to share information that is related to the Poplar Ridge Friends Meeting and the wider community of Friends. We are also pleased to include events and announcements that may be of interest to our members. These would include opportunities to express our Quaker testimonies such as donating time, services or goods. As the PRISM grows we have

found that we need to differentiate between these two types of information. To do this we will include a "Community Events" section in the newsletter. Poplar Ridge Meeting and Quaker related items will have priority for space and be included at the front of the PRISM. The "Community Events" section will follow as space allows. Everyone is welcome to submit items for the PRISM.

Sometimes people find that they know of an event or wish to share some information that did not make it into the PRISM. The various forms of communication on the Internet are useful for doing this. The PRISM announcements list will only be used for messages that are directly sponsored by the Meeting or one of its committees. We do not wish to overwhelm our readers with too many messages, thus dulling their impact. Announcements that do not fit into this category, or that did not make it into the monthly PRISM, should be posted on the Poplar Ridge Friends Facebook page. Announcements can also be made at the rise of meeting.

As our members follow their different leadings they often get very involved in issues. We encourage all who have strong leadings in social, environmental, or other issues pursued in the spirit of our beliefs, to share this information with the wider Poplar Ridge Friends Community through the various methods that we have available. We feel that this strong interest and activity is an important part of our Meeting and suggest that those who have a leading collect contact information from individuals that wish to receive their announcements directly. Mark Lemaire is known for his unique guitar style: he incorporates masterful fingerpicking, slap-and-tap harmonics, hand percussion, and a delicate touch that goes straight to your heart. While Mark's solo guitar pieces stand as complete statements, his harmonies with Cindy Lemaire are so perfectly matched that they seem like two people with one voice. At a show, audiences do a lot of laughing, but many are also moved to tears.
