MINUTES FOR POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS JUNE 17, 2018, POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING.

The Monthly Meeting opened with a period of worship about 11:50 a.m.; the minutes from the April meeting were read.

Attending were Ruth Bradley, Phyllis Bunker, David Connelly, Barry Kahn, Dill Otis, Hannah Richter, Christopher Sammond, Andy Simkin, Jane Simkin, Paul Simkin, and Charlie Weld.

- Ruth, our Treasurer, passed out a record of our year-to-date expenses. We have spent nearly \$18,000 on our \$36,839 annual budget. We have received \$8,800, about 24 percent of our annual budgeted contributions.
- Charlie reported for Ministry and Council that we purchased 15 copies of the current New York Yearly Meeting "Faith and Practice." The copies will be placed in our library. The book may also be read online. "Quaker Speaks" DVDs are also now available for newcomers in the Library.
- Reporting for the Building and Grounds Committee, Andy said the Committee is considering work this summer on needed Meetinghouse foundation repair, new siding and other projects.

Kathleen Connelly has made drawings for possibilities to improve accessibility to the Meetinghouse's basement for mobility impaired people. The Building Committee will be reviewing and discussing the drawings. Kathleen will make a more detailed presentation. Beforehand, the drawings will be sent to everyone on our email list.

- Hannah has been reaching out to form a committee to plan for our responsibilities at Fall Gathering next Sept. 15 at our Meetinghouse. Several people have volunteered to serve on that committee, Ruth, Ann Dalton, Jane Simkin, and Christopher.
- It was approved to participate in the Faith Days of the LGBTQ Booth at the State Fair on 8/25 and 8/26. It was approved to pay \$50 for a quarter-page ad in the LGBTQ Pride magazine publicizing our Meeting and its welcoming nature to all people. Ruth as treasurer will write a check and submit

the registration. The Outreach committee has been asked to work on the ad. Barry Kahn agreed to represent the Meeting at the Fair. Other volunteers are welcome.

We ended with a period of silence about 12:45 p.m.
