MINUTES FOR POPLAR RIDGE MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS JUNE 16, 2019

Meeting began with a period of silence. Howard then read the minutes from the April Business Meeting. Hannah greeted the new team of officers. She encouraged committees to name clerks, and to prepare guidelines and useful information in written form for the reference of new members.

Treasurer's Report: Andy reported in Ruth Bradley's absence. He gave a summary. Balance: \$86,169.41 Spending: \$23,726 (of \$46,706 annual budget, about 50%). Year to date donations: \$11,777 (25.2% of budget).

Hannah gave Ministry & Counsel report in Charlie Weld's absence. During Craig Kukuk's leave of absence in June, M&C has been covering pastoral duties.

Larry reported for Building Committee: We are waiting for clear weather for starting the parking lot project. Larry has been in contact with Chris Janssen, the contractor. It should be completed this summer. Building Committee will meet in the coming week to determine summer tasks needing to be done, including those related to the parking lot. Front porch refurbishing is another project on the radar.

Hannah said that she had received a letter from Barry Kahn. It was referred to M&C.

Howard read a communication from Charlie Greene of Owasco, asking for support (affixing our name to publicity) for a speaker, Clare Grady, one of the King's Bay 7, he is arranging to bring to the area in July. Discussion ensued. There was a wish for more specific information about topic. Andy suggested Peace & Social Action would be the appropriate committee to deal with this request. Howard will contact Charlie Greene for more info, the forward to P&SA, for their consideration.

Hannah received letter from Colin Saxton, Everance Stewardship consultant, regarding a meeting in August at Powell House on the topic "Creating Generous Congregations." Christopher spoke highly of Saxton's work and suggested that it would be good for PRMM to have representatives attend.
